MARS HILL FARMERS AND ARTISANS MARKET 2021 SEASON IS OPEN

Mars Hill Farmers and Artisans Market (MHFAM) takes place every Saturday until October 30th on Market Street on the campus of Mars Hill University in downtown Mars Hill. For the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic, MHFAM is operating under modified guidelines to ensure a safe and user-friendly shopping environment through social distancing with increased spacing between tents, limiting customers in the shopping area, handwashing stations and extra sanitation efforts, and contactless payment options. We are encouraging shoppers to pre-order from vendors using information provided on our website.

Market Hours and Location:

SATURDAYS IN MARS HILL: 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. College Street at Mars Hill University on Highway 213, in front of the Southern Appalachian Repertory Theatre. College Street will be closed to all vehicles during the market.

This year, we are continuing to accept EBT/SNAP transactions and to offer the Double Up Food Bucks program. This allows customers shopping with EBT/SNAP to be matched with up to an additional \$20 per day to spend on locally grown fresh fruits and vegetables at the market.

MHFAM has also partnered with Beacon of Hope's food pantry in Marshall. MHFAM will offer a donation station at the management tent where shoppers can leave donations to be picked up by Beacon of Hope at the end of each market day for distribution through their food pantry the following week. Shoppers are encouraged to purchase extra items from the vendors at market, or they may make a monetary donation through the market management or on our website, which the market will then use to purchase products from our vendors to be donated to Beacon of Hope. Our vendors may also choose to donate excess products to the donation efforts as well.

MHFAM customers can expect to find a variety of garden starts, fresh seasonal produce, locally prepared foods, handmade crafts, and herbal & homecare products including: fresh baked goods, ice cream, fresh locally roasted coffee, eggs, goats milk soaps, pork, chicken, grass fed beef, herb infused honeys, fire ciders, elixirs/tinctures, teas, flowers, handmade jewelry, handmade pottery, and more.
