

TOWN RECEIVES NCDEQ GRANTS TO CONDUCT **WATER & SEWER SYSTEM STUDY**

The Town of Mars Hill has been awarded two Asset Inventory and Assessment grants from the NC Department of Environmental Quality. The grants, one for the water system and one for the wastewater system, are \$150,000 each and will provide funding to facilitate the Town's ability to conduct thorough study and analysis of the water and sewer system assets and operations. The Town will develop an Asset Management Plan (AMP) which will help create a systematic process for assessing, repairing, and replacing critical assets for the Town's water and sewer utility. The project will include a full asset inventory and assessment of the condition of the Town's water and sewer systems, update system maps on GIS, a Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), an Operation and Maintenance Plan, and a financial model to schedule annual expenditures required to fund proposed capital improvements, including a rate study to reflect the potential for necessary changes to the Town's rates or rate structure to fund projects identified in the CIP. These major financial awards will position the Town to continue providing superior service to the residents of the Town of Mars Hill.

ANNUAL DRINKING WATER QUALITY REPORT AVAILABLE

The Town of Mars Hill has released the "Annual Drinking Water Quality Report for 2024." This report contains details about our water source, what the water contains, and how it compares to standards set by state and federal regulators. MARS HILL LETTER

MAYOR & ALDERMEN APPROVE BUDGET

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen received the budget presentation and held a public hearing on the FY 2025-26 budget at the June 2nd meeting. The budget was approved and is effective July 1st setting the Town's financial operations plan through June 30, 2026. The general fund budget is \$3,425,450 and the water and sewer fund is \$1,436,437.

It is the priority of elected officials and management to operate Town government in professional. efficient. business-like manner. The budget provides a priority spending plan that attempts to minimize the tax burden on the Town taxpayer. The Town's primary general fund sources of revenue are property, sales, and utility franchise taxes.

There is no change to the property tax rate for Fiscal Year 2025-26. The property tax rate is set at \$0.34 (thirtyfour) cents per \$100 (onehundred dollars) of valuation.

The water and sewer fund is an enterprise function which is required by the State of Carolina North supported only by the revenue generated from the service provided. In keeping with established Town policy, there will be a 2.5% increase in water and sewer usage fees. This increase is necessary to keep the water and sewer fund solvent while providing safe drinking water, processing wastewater, and making necessary capital improvements to the water and sewer system.
