PUBLIC INPUT NEEDED ON TOWN OF MARS HILL **BICYCLE + PEDESTRIAN PLAN**

The Town of Mars Hill is conducting a study of the Town's bicycle and pedestrian network. The goal of the plan is to assess current conditions, recommend a system of multimodal travel connecting bicyclists and pedestrians to key cultural resources in the Town, recommend programs and policies, provide an overview of plan implementation, and garner support for adoption of the plan by the Town's governing body.

The Mars Hill Bicycle + Pedestrian Plan will help evaluate future connections between the downtown core of Mars Hill with recreational, cultural, residential, and educational destinations throughout the Town. The study will document current conditions for bicyclists and pedestrians within the local transportation system, identifying opportunities for better connectivity, and will incor-

porate public input into the network analysis and recommendations for infrastructure, policy, and programs within the Town.

The project is led by the Town of Mars Hill with the support of NCDOT and French Broad River Metropolitan Planning Organization.

The Town of Mars Hill and its partners are seeking community input on the Bicycle + Pedestrian Plan. Community members can provide feedback by taking an online survey at the link included below or a

paper copy distributed by partner agencies. The survey will be open for public comment through June 21, 2024.

GAZEBO REVOVATION AND DEDICATION AS TRAMMELL FAMILY PARK

The Town of Mars Hill Mayor and Board of Aldermen joined the Mars Hill University Board of Trustees and President Tony Floyd on May 11, 2024, in celebration of the redevelopment and dedication of Gazebo Park located at the corner of Carl Eller Road and South Main Street.

As most know, the Town maintained the gazebo park as a public space for many years though an agreement with the private owner. MHU acquired the property in consultation and cooperation with town officials when the private owner placed the property for sale in late 2021. MHU and the Town worked together to ensure the property would remain a public park



for the community to continue to enjoy. The university was able to purchase the property, renovate the gazebo, and install beautiful new landscaping, stone walkways, a mill stone fountain, and outdoor lighting thanks to the generous contribution to MHU by former trustee Charlie Trammell and his family. The Town funded the installation of a stone pathway through the park to connect the S. Main sidewalk to the public parking area at the corner of Mountain View Road and Ivey Street.

The park was named and dedicated as the Trammell Family Park and is available for the community to enjoy.

POLICE DEPT. LAUNCHES SENIOR WELL-CHECK PROGRAM

Police Chief Chad Wilson and the Mars Hill Police Department announce the "Community Well-Check Program" to help with day-to-day safety and well-being of community residents who live alone in the city limits of the Town or Mars Hill. The program is designed to provide additional support for seniors, persons with medical disabilities, or persons who have special needs.

This program provides a daily check by phone for the participant. If the participant does not respond to the phone call, the police department will contact the emergency contact for the participant. If no contact can be made with the participant or their emergency contact, the police department will dispatch an officer to the participant address in an attempt to contact them to ensure they are safe.

Program Criteria

- Participant must be 65 years old or older or have a medical disability or have special needs
- Must live alone
- Cannot be living in a nursing facility
- Must have a home or cell phone
- Must live within the corporate town limits of Mars Hill
- Must have a relative or responsible party for emergency contact and serve as a key holder.
